Letter from the Director

I wrote in my 2018 Director's Report: "As the world changes, the power of libraries continues to be in our ability to support our communities, whatever the need." I did not realize then how true those words would ring two years later.

This year started like any other year, and then in what seemed the blink of an eye, almost everything changed. I say almost everything because though we had to make the unprecedented and heart-breaking decision to temporarily close our doors to the public, the one thing that did not change - did not even falter - was our staff's commitment and dedication to the communities in which we serve. As Julius C. Jefferson Jr., president of the American Library Association, said "Alongside the cumulative losses of 2020, we saw a year of opportunity. A year when library professionals answered the call to serve amid multiple crises...Libraries connected America in ways that have brought our communities closer......even when our buildings are not open, libraries are never closed."

It is in large part due to funds received through the state of Ohio and city of Lorain that we were able to outfit our staff and branches with the personal protection equipment necessary to safely reopen the doors to the public just months later.

Our annual report is usually broken out by branch or department, where each manager has opportunity to boast about their enhanced programs and services, new partnerships and capital improvements. This year we were not six individual branches, but a collaborative system working together to pivot on a dime and figure out how to create and post virtual programs, enhance resources and internet accessibility and offer librarian assistance remotely. Thus, the typical layout of our Annual Report needed to be altered.

We decided that the best way in which to report what happened during 2020 is to let the facts and the community members themselves do the talking. This year's Annual Report is made up of the actual headlines of many of our weekly press releases as well as quotes that were posted to our social media.

There is a motto here in the city of Lorain: "Lorain Proud." After reading this report, I hope that you can join me in being "Lorain Public Library System Proud."
