Our director, Joanne Eldridge, will retire this fall after serving at the Lorain Public Library System (LPLS) for over 22 years.

Eldridge said she is so grateful to the communities for supporting their libraries over the years. She beams when she talks about the importance of libraries.

"I believe the library is the fabric of a strong community. The library is interwoven into the community, intrinsically making it a good community. Communities thrive and excel when they have great libraries," Eldridge said.

Library Career

Starting as a children's librarian and working her way up to library director, Eldridge credits her career success to working diligently and being a team player. Running a library takes a team of dedicated employees and a community that supports it, she said. She's thankful for both.

Eldridge joined the LPLS family in September of 1994 as assistant director/ supervisor of branches. She said she's proud of her participation in the library system's continued expansion, including the construction of the new South Lorain Branch (March 2000) and North Ridgeville Branch (May 2003), and the major renovation of Columbia Branch (November 2003). Eldridge was appointed to library system director in December 2007. During her over-two-decades-long LPLS career, she's strived to maintain up-todate 21st century libraries that meet the needs of the public. She's worked tirelessly to ensure adequate funding for libraries whether through leading levy campaigns with staff and volunteers, or advocating for more state funding in Columbus.

Childhood and Adult Literacy

The library's role in helping to grow childhood and adult literacy has always been very important to Eldridge. She calls the Books for Babies literacy program one of her greatest accomplishments while at LPLS. Eldridge worked with the other public libraries serving Lorain County to secure a grant that would provide funding so parents of new babies would receive free books and other resources to encourage family literacy. Eldridge wants the library system to continue this noble work – to continue to empower children through reading.

"I would love to see more children have library cards. I'd love to see more adults reading so that children can see how important it is," she said.





Every day brings with it the opportunity to create new learning experiences, especially for children. The possibilities are all around you – you just need to recognize them.

After one or two stories on subjects that interest them, they'll be begging for more! Also take time every night to talk with your kids about what they did that day. Not only does this help improve their narrative skills, it's also a wonderful way to cement fun childhood memories in their mind.

By the time you turn out the lights, you'll have added so many learning moments to the day! It's important to take time to play and talk with your kids every day. Your whole family will benefit from it.
