

Avon Branch Library Now Offering Special Needs Programming



Lorain Public Library System's Avon Branch will now provide programs specifically designed for children with special needs and their families. Starting this winter are sensory story times, engaging music programs and informational sessions.

"We want everyone in Avon to feel like they belong at their library," said Avon Branch Librarian Supervisor Donna Kelly.

Parents told us their children with special needs often feel overwhelmed at the regularly occurring library story times. There may be too many children or too much stimuli. They would like to see programs specifically geared to their children's needs. They'd like programs where their kids can feel comfortable and flourish.

Christine Phelps, Avon Branch library associate, will lead Sensory Story Time once a month. This nurturing story time includes books, songs, movement and social time. The special needs story times are set up for a smaller group size so each child may receive personalized care.

Working with special needs children is rewarding and Phelps is looking forward to it.

"You get this great experience with the kids, and they are so wonderful,"
Phelps said. "The children are so happy and have fantastic attitudes. They love
to see you and are so excited," she said, referring to her previous experience
with special needs programming at a summer camp.

Each story program will finish with social time for parents to play with their kids, and for parents to connect with other parents and share resources.

"We want parents to know this is a comfortable place to bring their children,"

Phelps said. "This is a good way to introduce their children to story time without worrying about what other parents are thinking or what other kids are doing."

In addition to story times, here's what you can expect this winter.

- Musical Toolbox is a fun and engaging monthly music program presented by a board certified music therapist from MTEC, the Music Therapy Enrichment Center.
- Speech therapists from Mercy Rehabilitation Services will share techniques
 to maximize your child's reading experience. Intended for the parents of
 children 3 through 5 years of age, the session will cover how to enhance
 speech and language abilities, and vocabulary through books.
- Therapists from Mercy's outpatient rehab team will guide you in the fun ways to encourage your child, from birth to 3 years old, in all levels of development - from crawling to walking, talking and fine motor activities.
