Dinovember Wins Photo Contest



Celebrating National Hispanic Heritage Month





Expanded programming this year!





Lorain Public Library System has been celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month since the mid-1990s with special events and offerings. Traditionally, most of that programming has occurred at Main and South Lorain, but this year all six locations will be participating.

"The Library wants to invite people to learn something new about other cultures and to make it an enjoyable experience," said Ramona Flores, a librarian at Main.

National Hispanic Heritage Month is September 15 to October 15, and Lorain Public Library System is proud to pay tribute to the generations of Hispanic Americans—both nationally and locally—who have positively influenced our area and nation.

Flores said folkloric dance and ethnic food programming are always popular during Hispanic Heritage Month, so both will be well represented during this 30-day celebration. The Puerto Rican Dance group will perform the dance and songs of bomba y plena, complete with bongos, maracas and guitars.

Patrons can share their own dance moves by participating in a Salsa Aerobics class. Combining salsa dancing and aerobics, attendees will work up a sweat while soaking in some Hispanic culture.

With the popularity of the recent Pixar Animation Studios/Walt Disney Pictures film Coco, patrons of all cultural backgrounds will be intrigued by the Mexican Day of the Dead activities that will take place at several of the library system's locations. Patrons will learn more about and make paper marigold and sugar skull crafts that honor deceased relatives. With these crafts, patrons can decorate their own ofrendas--a type of non-worshipping altar decorated with flowers, pictures, food and other items dear to the departed family members. The Hispanic tradition is celebrated October 31-November 2.

"In the past, Hispanic Heritage programs have been more concentrated on Mexican and Puerto Rican culture," said Jamie Lauver, Main library manager. "This year there's an effort to branch out and showcase other countries."

One of those countries is Panama. There will be a Passport to Panama event featuring Panamanian food and tradition. The host will integrate the cultural aspects of Panama into the program while cooking-complete with sampling!

About National Hispanic Heritage Month

As explained on the hispanicheritagemonth.gov website

Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month from September 15 to October 15, by celebrating the histories, cultures and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean, and Central and South America. The observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson, and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period starting on September 15 and ending on October 15. It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988, on the approval of Public Law 100-402.

The day of September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on September 16 and September 18, respectively. Also, Columbus Day, or Dia de la Raza, which is October 12, falls within this 30-day period.

Library Services for Seniors

Accessing the LPLS collection has never been easier!

Lorain Public Library System offers senior adults a continuum of services to keep them immersed in their favorite books, magazines, music and more. From Books By Mail to Wii bowling we've got that!

Books By Mail

Homebound, recovering from surgery or caring for someone who is? Lorain Public Library System's Books By Mail service allows you to reserve materials and have them delivered right to your door by the U.S. Post Office.

The service is specifically for individuals who live within the library's service district, but cannot make it to their local branch due to transportation or medical issues.

"Anything you can check out in the library can be requested through Books By Mail," said Elaine Betting, Community Engagement Manager. "Some patrons have a running list of authors or titles that they like, and Books By Mail staff will order the next books in line when they've finished their current order."

The checkout period is five weeks for all Books By Mail items, and patrons can order multiple items at a time. The only restriction is the package cannot weigh more than 10 pounds. The library pays the postage unless the patron is eligible for free postage by USPS guidelines.

Betting estimates about 50 patrons currently participate in the Books by Mail program.

eLibrary

Seniors can also gain access to books, audio books, movies, music, magazines and more through the Lorain Public Library System's eLibrary. The eLibrary collection offers LPLS cardholders the freedom to download and/or

stream materials for free from wherever they are. All that's needed is a computer, laptop, tablet or mobile device.

Not sure how it all works? No problem! You don't have to be a techie to take advantage of this convenient service. Our staff can help you get started. Stop into your favorite branch to find out how to access this service online or via an app on your compatible device. Branch staff can even visit senior living communities and rehab services to teach patrons how to get started. And coming soon, we will be offering an eMedia service at area senior centers! (More information soon.)

"Many seniors are avid users of the eLibrary," said Donna Kelly Sprinkle, Avon branch

manager. "We have found high interest from this group in learning the technology needed to take advantage of the eLibrary. Our staff works with seniors in a hands-on, class setting, helping them set up their mobile devices or laptops with the apps needed."

Audio books are one of the most popular materials that seniors are downloading through the eLibrary, and staff is in the process of setting up audio book discussion groups at several of the branches.

Senior Programming

Besides borrowing materials, Lorain Public Library System offers many different programming options for our older patrons. Last year alone, more than 1,300 seniors attended a library program, participating in activities such as Tai-Chi for Arthritis, Sewing Club, history programs, book discussions, and knitting and crocheting groups. And new this fall, the Main Library will offer Wii bowling for seniors.
