What's in a Name : ...Connections!

Tom Saal, local cartoonist and writer, said the BBC series, *Connections* of 1978, that explores the paths of how technological change happens and the social effects of those changes on society, inspired him to submit the name suggestion for the LPLS newsletter.

He was intrigued, he said, by the theme of one thing leading to another and he envisions the knowledge gained from the library system acting similarly. He also says that the library's many eMedia services help build on and make those connections easier.

The 85-year-old contributor spent most of his working life in New York and Cleveland in advertising and publishing; but writing about automobiles and racing is his passion. His work includes *Famous but Forgotten*, the life story of Cleveland auto manufacturer Alexander Winton (Winton Place), *Damn Few Died in Bed*, the life story of Andrew Dunlop, a champ car chief mechanic, and *Tommy Saal's ABCs of Auto Racing History*.

A lifelong patron of the library system, Saal joined the Friends of the North Ridgeville Library soon after moving to North Ridgeville with his wife, Judith, in 2004. He is a graduate of St. Ignatius high school (1950) and Xavier University (1954).

A big round of applause and thanks goes out to all those who participated in the naming competition as well as the panel of judges who helped make the selection. We received much thoughtful input that included name suggestions, marketing strategies and drawings. So, the next time we need creative direction, we know we can count on you! LPLS Helps Shine

International Spotlight on Lorain

The Lorain International Festival and Bazaar lands in downtown Lorain June 22-24, and Lorain Public Library System is honored to be the Spotlight Industry at this year's event.

The 52nd annual festival is a premier summer event that celebrates the city's nationalities and cultures through food, music, costume, art, pageantry and tradition. Activities take place in various downtown locations, as well as along the banks of the scenic Black River.

A highlight of the International Festival is the annual kick-off parade, and as this year's spotlight business, LPLS is ready to rock and roll with a float that highlights the 2018 Summer Library program theme: Libraries Rock! LPLS staff will be dressed up as rock stars from different eras, and some of these "stars" will walk the parade, handing out candy and toys.

Main Library Assistant Nina Lopez shared that the last time the library was the Spotlight Industry for the Lorain International Festival was in 2001, during LPLS' centennial anniversary.

"All attendees will be in for a real treat as we plan to make this year's festival our best effort yet," said Lopez.

LPLS will share the spotlight with Puerto Rico, the 2018 Spotlight Nationality. LPLS is honored to share this recognition with Puerto Rico, especially after the devastating affects Hurricane Maria had on the island.

LPLS, with the help of its patrons, turned library fines into donations, and presented a check for nearly \$5,000 to El Centro toward the Hurricane Maria Relief Fund for Puerto Rico.

FULL STEAM AHEAD:

Discovery on the GO.

Children's literacy is going mobile as Lorain Public Library System introduces its newest outreach venture: Discovery on the Go. This mobile library initiative rolls out this summer, coming to a park, festival, neighborhood or event near you.



The new program's primary focus area is emerging literacy for preschoolers, who will be introduced to STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and math) to gain background knowledge, vocabulary and critical thinking skills. Children will have the opportunity to check out STEAM-related books from the vehicle.

The secondary focus will be reading skills for kindergarteners through third-graders. The initiative is designed to engage readers with informational text — a goal of the

This age group typically spends a lot of time reading in the classroom without much choice in subject matter. The Discovery program enables students to choose and check out books ranging from science and technology to nonfiction and poems.

LPLS Director Anastasia Diamond-Ortiz and Public Services Coordinator for Youth and Outreach Services Elaine Betting creatively collaborated on this idea after seeing Cleveland Museum of Art's mobile art studio, Studio Go. Besides the mobile library collection of books, Discovery on the Go will include tools such as LEGOs, Keva Planks, art supplies, Ozobots and Snap Circuits in keeping with the STEAM theme.

Another benefit of Discovery On the Go is to connect state standard-based curriculum with these young students. And with takehome activities, the STEAM learning doesn't have to end once the vehicle departs. Parents are encouraged to continue engaging at home with activity sheets.

"This new vehicle can take us to festivals, parks, neighborhoods and schools with specific STEAM learning goals for kids and families. We will pilot some programs this summer, with an official schedule rolling out in the fall," said Betting.

LPLS will utilize the mobility of the vehicle to reach and impact as much of the Lorain community as possible, with an emphasis on daycares, preschools and elementary schools, in areas that are more than a mile from a library branch and with high poverty and racial diversity.

Discovery on the Go is on a mission to deliver the library experience to youngsters throughout the Lorain community.

Common Core Standards. The Common Core State Standards Initiative details what K-12 students throughout the United States should know in English language arts and mathematics at the conclusion of each grade.

"We thought, 'Why can't we do that?' But we wanted to put a library spin on it, and we wanted to find a way to engage the community, where traditional bookmobile and book truck stops weren't working," Betting said.



Life-saving Medical Devices

Two life-saving devices are now available at your local LPLS locations.



AED Devices Located at Libraries

Sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) is a leading cause of death in the United States. More than 350,000 cardiac arrests occur outside of the hospital each year. Twelve percent of those victims survive. Because SCA can happen to anyone at any time, LPLS is implementing an AED program to prepare employees to respond to an SCA emergency.

Portable automated external defibrillator (AED) devices, located near the circulation desk of each library, are now part of each library's equipment. AEDs treat sudden cardiac arrest, which can cause death if not treated within minutes.

These lightweight, battery-operated, devices are easy to operate, providing voice prompts to guide the user through the process of checking the heart and sending an electric shock to restore a normal rhythm if necessary.

The American Red Cross credits the AED as the *only effective treatment* for restoring a regular heart rhythm during sudden cardiac arrest.

Blood Pressure Kits Now Available for Checkout

Patrons can now check out a blood pressure kit for seven days to track and monitor blood pressure readings. The kit includes a: blood pressure device, quick user card, AC adapter and four batteries. Look for it in the Circulation section of the library.





And the experts from BRAS will be able to answer your astronomical questions. Immediately following the program, we will set up telescopes outside for a night observing session.



Columbia Township has had many firsts. It is the longest running settlement in the Western Reserve west of the Cuyahoga River (inhabited since 1807). It also had the first teacher and classroom, first cemetery, first doctor and first organized church society.

This community of about 7,000 residents is proud of its rich history, and the Columbia Branch and the Columbia Historical Society are collaborating to preserve that history.

Inside the Columbia Branch a unique mural depicts the township's history in photographs tile by tile. The branch also frequently shares an end-cap display commemorating the history of the township. More recently, Columbia purchased several large, lateral filing cabinets for the Historical Society, which will be used

to store its artifacts. The first items that have been transferred over to the cabinets include a collection of annuals and yearbooks. Photographs and pamphlets about Columbia's rich railroad and greenhouse history, as well as family histories and homecoming celebrations, are just some of the other artifacts that will soon be archived at the library.

"We're all tied together," said Blanche Nemeth, president of the Columbia Historical Society. "We are working to promote education of the history of our community."

Nemeth said the artifacts will be safer at the library in its climate-controlled environment, and be more conveniently accessible for patrons wanting to do genealogy research. Although the artifacts won't be able to be checked out, they can be reviewed on the spot and copies can be made.


Columbia Branch Librarian Supervisor Susan Spivey said the library is a natural stop for anyone looking for any sort of historical information.
